
MISSION

We bring together US and Japanese underrepresented changemakers, to unlock their full potential, by engaging in an exchange program with thought leaders, innovators, and industry pioneers.

- Opportunities to meet and engage in dialogue with diverse leaders and innovators in Silicon Valley and Japan.
- Hands-on workshops designed to foster mutual learning and collaboration.
- Opportunities to learn the structure and characteristics of innovation ecosystems in the U.S. and Japan
- Networking with a community of peers and future collaborators

PROGRAM

- Orientation sessions held in participants' home countries
- 5-day workshop in Silicon Valley, including visits to companies and startup founders
- 5-day workshop in Japan, including visits to SVJP member companies/CEOs and other organizations
- Final presentations and debrief sessions held in participants' home countries
- Alumni community



PROGRAM FEE

The program is fully funded through a dedicated SVJP-managed fund, and no costs will be incurred by participants.





WHO WE'RE LOOKING FOR

We encourage applications from individuals who have had limited access to leadership or entrepreneurial opportunities due to various circumstances.

This program is designed for people who:

- want to turn their lived experiences and minority perspectives to drive positive social change
- · aspire to grow as inclusive, globally minded leaders
- seek to become role models in spaces where few exist today
- are interested in social innovation or entrepreneurship
- are eager to expand their potential and take on new challenges

Note: This is not an accelerator program and is not intended for entrepreneurs seeking funding or investors.

Eligibility:

- 18 years or older, based in Japan or the U.S.
- Able to travel to both Japan and the U.S. (or obtain valid travel authorization on your own)
- Open to college students and working professionals
- Able to participate in all components of the program in person without major conflicts (e.g. academic exams, work obligations)
- Basic communication skills in Japanese or English (fluency not required)
- This year's program is in a pilot phrase and will prioritize applicants who are able to participate independently. We strive to expand support and accessibility in future editions.

SELECTION PROCESS



First Round: Document Screening

Review of application form and letters of recommendation.



Second Round: Short Movie and/or Essay Submission

Applicants will submit a short video or essay (in Japanese or English) introducing their current work and motivation for joining the program.

WHO WE ARE

The Silicon Valley Japan Platform (SVJP) was established in 2016 with the mission of fostering innovation through a trusted Japan-U.S. network. It is co-hosted and operated by the U.S.-Japan Council and the International House of Japan (formerly the Asia Pacific Initiative).

At the core of SVJP is its Annual Retreat, which brings together business leaders, investors, entrepreneurs, policymakers, and researchers from both countries for candid dialogue on social challenges and emerging technologies. Since 2020, increased participation from entrepreneurs has led to the formation of a new community where corporate decision-makers and startup founders engage on a level playing field.

In 2024, Saima Hassan and Naoaki Mashita were appointed as co-chairs. Even in an increasingly uncertain world, SVJP remains committed to empowering the next generation of U.S.-Japan innovators by providing a practical platform for future-oriented dialogue.
